Things to See and Do in Reno

It's time to find out what the "Biggest Little City in the World" has to offer as you base yourself in your WorldMark resort in downtown Reno, Nevada. This historic destination successfully combines natural beauty with lavish evening entertainment, lively casinos, fine dining and some of the best shopping in the state. The Reno area also offers year-round vacation possibilities. You can go downhill or cross-country skiing at world-class resorts, horseback riding, rafting, water-skiing, biking or fishing. You might take in a stage show, try your hand at poker, roulette or blackjack. You can also test your golfing skills at one of the area's 40 public courses. Reno is definitely a whole lot more than just gambling.

Starting with Reno's wild side, there's the **Animal Ark Wildlife Sanctuary**—home to kit foxes, wolves, black bear, mountain lion, burrowing owls and more. In addition to being able to see animals, the ark also has picnic tables, docent guides, educational displays, animal demonstrations depicting natural behavior and a gift shop.

But that hardly scratches the surface of Reno's natural storehouse. From enjoyment as simple and close-at-hand as a walk or bike ride along the banks of the **Truckee River** in downtown Reno (where you can take advantage of the two-level promenade with its shops, restaurant and 12-screen cinema),

to true mountain-loving action, Reno has it all.

For downhill skiing, Reno has two ski areas nearby, and many more near the **Lake Tahoe Basin**—including **Mount Rose** (with the highest base in the region, not to mention great powder) and **Diamond Peak at Incline Village** (with fine views of the Tahoe area). For cross-country, consider **Diamond Peak** or **Spooner Lake**. And with Lake Tahoe practically in Reno's backyard (only 25 miles southwest of the city, and easily reached by several all-weather highways), true year-round recreational paradise is also yours—from boating and fishing to watersports—all summer long.

Of course, one can't overlook Reno's golf scene. The region is so varied you can practically name your terrain: mountains, deserts, forest or lakes. The scenery takes your breath away and your shots will soar through the thin mountain air.

As for museums, Reno seems to preserve just about anything that sits still long enough to put behind glass. You can see impressionist paintings at the **Nevada Museum of Art**, glimpses of the galaxy at the **Fleischmann Planetarium** and more than 200 antique, vintage and classic cars (not to mention displays with clothing and lifestyles of the period) at the **National Automobile Museum**. You

might consider a visit to the nearby state capital, **Carson City**, where you can visit the **historic mint building** or the **Nevada State Museum** with its exhibits on local history and Nevada memorabilia. Possibly the most popular part of this museum is its underground mine in the basement. Other favorite Northern Nevada museums include the **Nevada Gambling Museum**, **Mark Twain Museum**, **Wild West Museum** and, in **Virginia City**, **Bullette's Red Light Museum** (the only museum of prostitution in the nation).

But it wouldn't be right to talk about Reno and not mention the close to 30 **casinos** in the area. Reno's early mining days may be over, but the rush is still in full swing ... and is waiting to take your money. If you're lucky, you may win more than you spend!

Driving Directions

From Sacramento, CA

- Take I-80 East toward Reno.
- Take the Virginia St downtown exit.
- Turn right at the stop sign on Virginia St.
- **Go to 2nd St and turn right.**
- **Proceed to Arlington St, three blocks down, and turn right. The resort is 1/2 block on the right.**

From Carson City, NV

- Take US 395 North.
- Take Exit 68 to I-80 West, the Reno/Sacramento exit.
- Take the Virginia St downtown exit.
- Turn left onto Virginia St.
- Follow the **bold** directions above.

From Las Vegas, NV

- Take US 95 North.
- At Tonopah, go west on US 6/95.
- Rejoin US 95, heading north through Fallon.
- Take US 50 West to I-80.
- Go west on I-80, and take the Virginia St downtown exit.
- Turn left onto Virginia St.
- Follow the **bold** directions on the left.

From Salt Lake City, UT

- Coming in on I-80 West, take the Virginia St downtown exit.
- Turn left onto Virginia St.
- Follow the **bold** directions to the left.
